



A performance by the North Cheshire Wind Orchestra at the Royal Northern College of Music on June 30th will feature the world premiere of a new work by a local composer.

Wirral-based Gary Carpenter's 'Runcorn Bridge' will be played in a concert at 7.30pm in the Studio Theatre at the RNCM on Oxford Road, Manchester. Conductor Catherine Tackley will give a pre-concert talk at 6.50pm.

Gary Carpenter has written four operas, five musicals and a radio music drama – The One Alone - with Dame Iris Murdoch as well as working on film scores, several ballets and a large amount of concert music. He regularly guests as a professor on National Youth Orchestra courses and was musical director and arranger-orchestrator on many films including The Wicker Man and The Hitchhiker's Guide To The Galaxy.

The Orchestra (formerly known as the North Cheshire Concert Band) is a symphonic wind orchestra based in Warrington. They perform regularly at the town's Pyramid and Parr Hall and play a wide range of music including standard repertoire by composers including Gershwin, Bernstein, Holst and Strauss, as well as unusual modern works, and new compositions commissioned by the ensemble.
